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THE VALUE OF HOME VISITING/FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Maternal home visiting programs support pregnant and parenting women and their families during the early stages of their children's lives. They do so by providing parents and caregivers with a strong foundation of education and resources to help them raise children who are physically, emotionally and socially healthy.

Many families do not have sufficient knowledge, parenting skills or an adequate support system of family, friends and health care professionals to provide necessary care for themselves and their children¹. The availability of home visiting programs is a proven strategy for supporting and strengthening vulnerable families by matching them with trained professionals who provide parental education, linkage with community services, and the promotion of infant and family health within the home².

This directory of Philadelphia-based home visiting programs was developed by Strategy Arts (strategyarts.com) and a small group of maternal and child health consultants*, with support from the Obstetrical Society of Philadelphia (OSP) and the Maternal, Child and Family Health Division of the Philadelphia Department of Public Health's Healthy Start Community Action Network (CAN). The CAN is led by Healthy Start programs at the Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH) and the Maternity Care Coalition (MCC) and Einstein Medical Center (EMC). The goal of the directory is to help maternal and child health care providers better support families by connecting them with the services offered by the city's twelve home visitation programs.
