The Workforce Connection offers access to programs that provide opportunities for young people between the ages of 16 ó 21 in Boone and Winnebago Counties to complete their education and train in areas that help build a foundation to enhance their future.

The goal of all programs for <u>in-school youth</u> (ages 16-21) is to help the youth be successful in school, enabling them to graduate and continue their education/training and/or gain unsubsidized employment. In addition to tutoring youth in school subjects and counseling/mentoring the youth, all inschool programs provide career awareness and work readiness activities.

Programs for youth who have dropped <u>out of</u> <u>school</u> (ages 17-21) emphasize the importance of youth returning to school or obtaining a GED as a basic step on their road to success. Programs provide basic skills, GED instruction, tutoring, counseling, mentoring, career exploration, work experience, and job placement assistance.

PROGRAMS FOR IN-SCHOOL YOUTH

Boone County Special Education Cooperative Boone County Youth at Work

The program provides Special Education youth from Belvidere and North Boone High Schools with work readiness skills training and work opportunities.

Rock Valley College Refugee and Immigrant Services Project Youth Program

The program targets refugee and immigrant youth who attend Guilford High School, where the Rockford School District's bi-lingual program is housed.

Rockford Public Schools School to Work Program

The program works to place WIA eligible juniors and seniors who are receiving vocational Special Education in permanent, competitive employment by the time they graduate from high school or soon after they graduate. The program provides vocational instruction (another funding source), work readiness skills training, and intensive placement assistance, focusing on extensive job coaching.

YMCA of Rock River Valley Learn to Earn

The program serves at-risk youth aged 16 and older. The program provides extensive mentoring and counseling, job-readiness and life-skills instruction, job shadowing, internships (with job coaching by program staff), and tutoring.

This program targets at-risk youth ages 16-18, helps them complete high school and teaches them about starting their own business. The program is designed to present the concepts of entrepreneurship while providing students with academic support and paid work experience

PROGRAMS FOR OUT-OF-SCHOOL YOUTH

The program provides a comprehensive educational and job readiness program for youth 17-18 who have dropped out of school, enabling them to complete high school or earn a GED.

The program serves 17-21 year old youth from Boone and Winnebago counties, emphasizing their obtaining a GED as the basic link to future training and successful employment.

The program helps youth obtain their GED certification, enter advanced training and/or gain employment or improve their current earnings with a better job, and develop an appreciation for lifelong learning.

Youth wishing to enroll in the Youth Programs offered by The Workforce Connection must meet Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Eligibility Requirements.

You or someone in your household must:

- Be receiving or have been approved to receive food stamps within the last six months or be receiving SSI, TANF or Township Assistance or be homeless, or
- Family household combined gross income for the past 26 weeks must fall at or below posted maximum limits.

If you are in-school, you will receive tutoring to help you be successful in school, graduate, gain employment and/or go on to further training.

If you are out of school and have not completed high school, you will receive assistance to help you earn your GED, gain employment, and/or go on to further training.
